In-Demand Healthcare Jobs

The Workforce Services Division of Will County has identified 19 high-demand jobs with available training programs in the healthcare field, which are listed on the back page with related wage and training information. Certain healthcare occupations may require testing or licensure. Most require drug testing and criminal background checks.

Outlook & Growth

In Will County, employment in the healthcare industry is projected to grow 17% through 2020, much faster than the average for all occupations, creating about 2,400 job openings. In fact, healthcare occupations will add more jobs than any other group of occupations.



Training

Jobs in Will County's healthcare industry require education and training after high school, yet they don't always require a four year degree. Depending on your career interests and professional goals, you can choose a training program from several weeks to more than four years. Here are some examples below:




